Dear School Family,

I found the following article from the Department of Education that talks about the importance of talking and listening to your child. As I grow older, I find that we must very intentional with our personal interactions with our children as our attention is being diverted with cell phones, and other electronic devices. Research shows that relationships (others belief in you and the belief in oneself) are still the greatest indicator of success. Please look over the following article and see how you can incorporate intentional listening and speaking with your child into your day.

Find Time to Talk to Your Child

Talking and listening play major roles in children's school success. It's through hearing parents and family members talk and through responding to that talk that young children begin to pick up the language skills they will need if they are to do well.

Think of talking with your child as being like a tennis game with words-instead of a ball-bouncing back and forth. Find time to talk any place, for example:

- As you walk with your child or ride with her in a car, talk with her about what she's doing at school. Point out and talk about things that you see as you walk-funny signs, new cars, and interesting people.
- As you shop in a store, talk with your child about prices, differences in brands, and how to pick out good vegetables and fruit.
- As you fix dinner, ask your child to help you follow the steps in a recipe. Talk about what can happen if you miss a step or leave out an ingredient.
- As you read a book with your child, pause occasionally to talk to him about what's happening in the book. Help him to relate the events in the book to events in his life. Ask him to tell in his own words what the book was about. Ask him about new words in a book and help him to figure out what they mean. *The U.S. Department of Education*

Think not only of what you can teach your child, but what you can learn from them.


